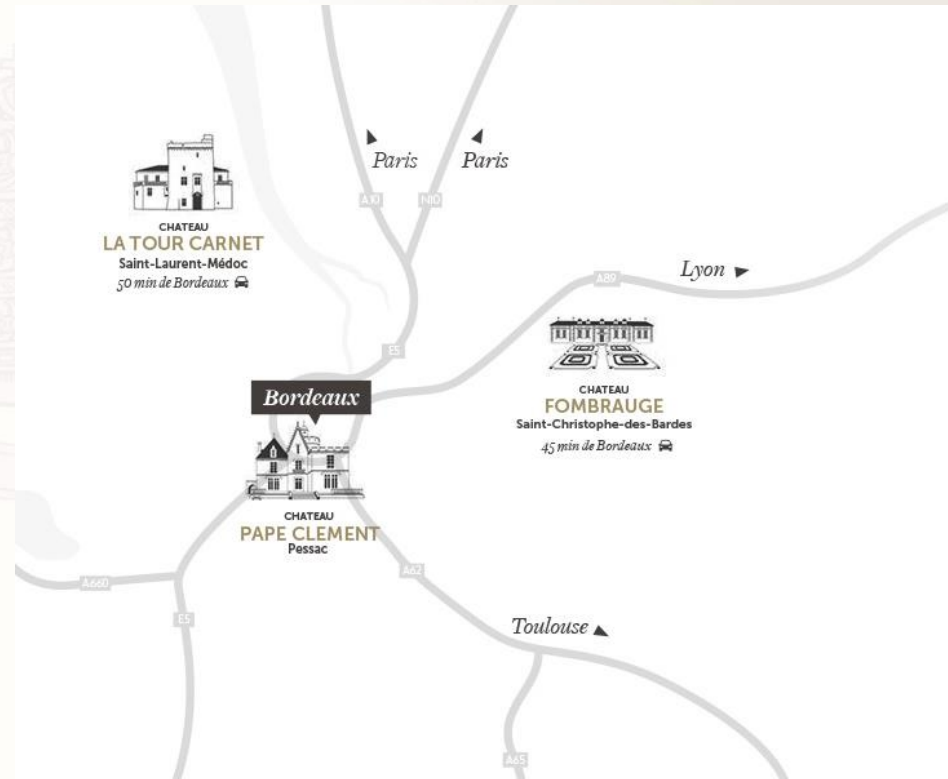

There is something magical, poetic and noble about this magnificent room. It has very much of a château feel, from the golden-embroidered bed on a dais to the large pediment mirror set above the white marble fireplace.

Entering the Clos des Songes, one is immediately struck by the antique lacquered wood furniture and the parquet floor reflecting the sun.

This elegant room is decorated in beige, white and gold and the style is not exactly understated: the medallions on the fabric scintillate, like gilding on the crystal chandelier and the Alicante red marble of the elegant bathroom.

## *L'Egrégore*

## *Mon Seul Rêve*

## *La Tempérance*



With all the bearing of a grande dame, La Tempérance epitomises the charm of times past. The massive, tapestry-covered master bed, with richly decorated and embroidered bed linen, sits atop a glossy parquet floor.

The pendant chandelier, an elegant gem of scintillating crystal, highlights the pink marble of the adjacent large bathroom.

Leaning on the window sill, one is captivated by the sight of a majestic cedar of Lebanon and a view of estate that stretches as far as the eye can see.

## *La Sérénité*



Time seems to stand still here, immortalising the impression of serenity in a Charles X atmosphere conferred by the elm-burl furniture.

## *Le Pavillon du Prêlat*

Proudly standing between the vineyard and the château, the delicate glasshouse built by Gustave Eiffel is a dynamic part of the estate.

Starting at dawn, the sun's rays diffract through the Pavillon du Prêlat's lacelike stained glass while guests admire the beautiful view of the surrounding vineyard.

As evening approaches, the light from the ceiling lamp in turn illuminates chairs and immaculate white tablecloths with its iridescent reflections.





# *La Salle de L'Orangerie*

Impressively attractive with varied shades of red and gold in the curtains, walls and every decorative element, the Orangery Room receives guests in a royal atmosphere illuminated by majestic Louis XV chandeliers.

Opening entirely onto the estate, L'Orangerie is an eminently pleasurable, innovative venue full of history for conferences, cocktail receptions, and wedding banquets.





## *Private Dining Room*

Make your dream of feeling that you own a château come true by hosting a cocktail reception, sharing a meal with special guests, or celebrating a success in the château's Salle à Manger Privée (Private Dining Room).

This intimate, refined room has retained all its 18th century charm. Guided to the room by the smell of polished furniture, your guests will appreciate the warm, refined atmosphere in this timeless place.

The windows offer a peaceful view of a vineyard that has existed for centuries.



## *La Salle des Boiseries*

The wood panelled room is a very elegant setting that definitely exudes a "château" atmosphere - ideal for prestige dinners, cocktail receptions, and management meetings.

This splendid, Louis XV-style room, bathed in sunlight, looks out over the gardens, vines, and the Eiffel glasshouse, . The fine woodwork is complimented by satin-covered chairs and delicate net curtains.

Furthermore, Bernard Magrez has decided to keep a collection of his top wines here, as well as several precious musical instruments.





## *The cellars*

The cellars, or cellars, house wines made with expertise, according to a tradition of excellence dating back to the Middle Ages. The Salle des Chais has treasures housed in oak as far as the eye can see.

Each barrel contains Bernard Magrez's "Bordeaux diamonds" and the venue is utterly enchanting.

## *The Vat Room*

The aromas of oak blend with those of great growth wines that macerate there after every harvest and will sharpen your guests' appetite.

Tables are set up beside the immense wooden vats for refined meals or unusual cocktail receptions.



# *Le Château Fombrauge, a bucolic and rural experience*



This former Carthusian monastery retains something of its religious past. Beautifully-proportioned, Château Fombrauge has been a wine estate since the 16th century

The perfectly-aligned vine rows stretch to the horizon like strings patiently waiting to vibrate under the vineyard workers' hands.

This synergy between man and nature led to the creation of one of the oldest *grands crus classés* in Saint-Emilion: Château Fombrauge.



## *The Cadran Suite*

Authentic and timeless, the Château Suite has retained all the charm of a bygone era. The centuries-old four-poster bed, as well as the dark-wood chairs and chest of drawers on the lacquered parquet floor belonged to the original owners.

Bright and majestic, this suite decorated with crimson and carmine-red fabric reflects its history with bucolic scenes on *toile de Jouy* printed fabric.



## *The Promesse Suite*



This attractive, prestigious suite with floral decorations has retained all the charm of the Louis XV period, reflected in the bronze chandelier and embroidered armchair.

In order to provide a luxurious, unforgettable experience, the Château Guerry suite also has a delicate bed crown. The pink marble fireplace reveals spring-like nuances in the bright sunlight and the poetry continues in the small living room that leads off the bedroom.

The armchair and crimson velvet sofa make this an ideal place to enjoy tea, read, or chat with friends. This beautiful suite also surprises guests with its spacious, unabashedly modern bathroom.



## *Reception Room*

The unique, authentic character of this location gives wedding celebrations, banquets and conferences a somewhat solemn aspect.

The atmosphere is imbued with history going back many years and a particularly French form of refinement.

Private artworks belonging to Bernard Magrez are displayed alongside paintings and antique furniture underneath solid wooden beams. The wine-themed art and tailor-made luxury of this reception room make for an outstanding ambience.



## *Dining room*

Meetings and delicious dinners may be held in the intimate surroundings of the owner's private art collection and elegant antique furniture, across from an impressive black marble fireplace.

The spirit of the Marquis de Fombrauge continues hovers over the vast dining room of this former Carthusian monastery. Convivial and sunlit along its whole length, it opens onto the château grounds and vines.



# *A Stay in Château Château La Tour Carnet, a journey through time and space*



One of the oldest properties in the Médoc, La Tour Carnet's beautiful medieval tower houses the treasures of troubadours, the spirit of Michel de Montaigne and La Boétie



The château has enormous character and contemplates its 900 years of history in the water of the surrounding moat, only crossed by an elegant drawbridge.



## *Michel de Montaigne - Suite*

Let your imagination roam in the medieval ambience, among the enchantments of nature, fantastic animals from folk tales, and reminders of a royal past.

Lions among gilded leaves on the bed canopy, bronze rams on the bedside lamps, and gold-embroidered, red-velvet Renaissance, set on each side of the ancient fireplace, decorated with holly leaves complete the decor. Royal blue drapes, red fabrics, and embroidered Fleur de Lys provide a historical backdrop.



At sunrise, blue tits and goldfinches invite you to gaze over the superb vineyards and gardens of the château. Its vaulted ceiling, antique tiled floor, and black Marquina marble make the bathroom reminiscent of a Roman baths.



## *La Boétie - Suite*



The La Boétie room is a carefully-composed metaphor in high style with a strikingly authentic touch. A stay in this illustrious room at Château La Tour Carnet is an invitation to experience the same pleasure in the symbols of Antiquity as Montaigne did himself.

The marble walls are reminiscent of busts of Roman emperors and a Byzantine console table decorated with lions' heads adds an impressive touch to this highly-individual decor, while the fabric and sculpted columns of the four-poster bed are decorated with bunches of grapes and vine leaves. Reflecting the intellectual stature of La Boétie, the room that bears his name features many reminders of a rich cultural heritage.





## *The Dining Room*

This room continues to reflect its medieval past, when troubadours and minstrels played at copious banquets.

The Hundred Years' War and the vicissitudes of history fortunately did no harm to La Tour Carnet, and its beautiful Dining Room encapsulates the tranquil atmosphere that reigns throughout the château.

This room is ideal for small, intimate events: important meetings and gourmet meals with business colleagues or special friends.
